## Accreditation and Registration

WFBC offers full-time and part-time courses and is also in partnership with the South African Theological Seminary (SATS), enabling students to enrol for accredited qualifications with SATS, which is registered with the Department of Education and accredited by the Council on Higher Education to offer the following programmes:

- Certificate in Christian Life
- Certificate of Christian Counselling
- Certificate in Worship Studies
- Bachelor of Theology
- Master of Theology
- Doctor of Philosophy in Theology

## Legal Status of WFBC

WFBC is a Department of Word of Faith Christian Centre which is a church registered as a nonprofit organisation (025-230-NPO) and WFBC itself is in turn also registered as a nonprofit organisation (022-391-NPO).

## Legal Status of SATS

SATS is registered as a Section 21 company (reg. no. 2002/005184/08), a PBO (18/11/13/2403) and a nonprofit organisation (033-343-NPO).

The seminary is also a founder member of the National Association of Distance Education Organizations in South Africa and the Christian Private Higher Education Forum, and is a member of the Association of Private Providers of Education, Training and Development, the South African Institute for Distance Education, the International Council for Evangelical Theological Education, the International Council for Higher Education and the World Evangelical Theological Institute Association. Their accreditation and Department of Education registration provide assurance that the quality of their programmes is of the highest standard. Their programmes are therefore **nationally and internationally comparable** and the credits earned with them are truly "portable," i.e. they can be transferred to other accredited, registered institutions. The increasing number of international students confirms the acceptability of their programmes around the world.

## Recognition of Prior Learning

If you have already studied elsewhere or if you have appropriate ministry experience, you will probably qualify for prior learning credits, which will reduce the total cost and duration of your educational programme. You will be charged at a nominal rate for credits that you have earned at institutions which are not accredited and registered, and for life experience, but all other prior learning credits are free (see *Pricing*).

As soon as WFBC submits your application form to SATS, they will evaluate your existing qualifications and experience and advise you of the credits they are

provisionally prepared to grant. They will then also advise you how to formalise these credits. These evaluations will be valid for a period of three months.

## **Advantages of Studying with a College like WFBC which is in partnership with SATS:**

- You may enrol at any time of the year.
- You pay only for the subjects you are studying.
- All programmes are accredited by the Council on Higher Education and registered by the Department of Education (see *Accreditation and Registration*).
- All courses are very reasonably priced.
- The credits you earn as you pass each subject accumulate towards your chosen qualification.
- The courses are aimed at equipping you and preparing you for your ministry. They are very practical but also contain the necessary academic components.
- You will not need to purchase many textbooks as most subjects are completely self contained. This saves you a great deal of money.
- You will receive your courses via e-learning.
- You receive credits for prior learning and life experience (see *Recognition of Prior Learning*).
- The tutors are always available to assist you.
- Updated information, newsletters and conferences keep you in touch.

## **Enrolment Requirements**

### **1. Certificates**

To register for any Certificate programme, prospective students require **one** of the following:

- 1.1. National Senior Certificate as certified by Umalusi. Applicants with different qualifications may only be admitted if they are judged equivalent by the designated equivalence-setting bodies.
- 1.2. A tertiary qualification at an accredited institution registered by the Department of Education.
- 1.3. A tertiary qualification at a foreign institution accredited by a recognised accrediting body or by the institution's national government. Certified/notarised proof of one of the above requirements should accompany the application form, together with a certified/notarised copy of the student's Identification Document or valid Passport.

All those who meet these criteria and whose English is of a sufficient standard, are accepted into the programme.

## 2. Bachelor of Theology

To register for this programme, prospective students require one of the following:

- 2.1. National Senior Certificate as certified by Umalusi, with an achievement rating of 4 (50%–59%) or better in four recognised NSC twenty-credit subjects from the designated list in the Minimum Admission Requirements for Higher Certificate, Diploma and Bachelor's Degree Programmes requiring a National Senior Certificate, Government Gazette, Vol. 482, No. 27961, 18 August 2005.

Applicants with different qualifications may only be admitted if they are judged equivalent by the designated equivalence-setting bodies. Alternatively a Higher Certificate or Advanced Certificate in a cognate field will satisfy the minimum requirement.

- 2.2. A tertiary qualification at an accredited institution registered by the Department of Education.
- 2.3. A tertiary qualification at a foreign institution accredited by a recognised accrediting body or by the institution's national government.

Certified/notarised proof of one of the above requirements should accompany the application form, together with a certified/notarised copy of the student's Identification Document or valid Passport.

All those who meet these criteria and whose English is of a sufficient standard, are accepted into the programme.

To register for any Master's programme, prospective students require an accredited four-year degree (or equivalent) in an appropriate field.

To register for the Doctorate of Theology programme, you need a relevant, accredited Master's degree.

### English Bridging Course

If you feel that your English is very weak, SATS have an excellent bridging course designed to help you improve your language skills. Please note that the language of instruction is English.

### Enrolment Procedures

When you are ready to apply, please complete the application form and mail it together with certified/notarised copies of original Diplomas, Certificates, Transcripts and Identification Document or valid Passport to: Word of Faith Bible College, P.O. Box 7698, Newton Park, 6055 Port Elizabeth. These documents can also be sent as e-mail attachments to the following: [myrna@wordoffaith.org.za](mailto:myrna@wordoffaith.org.za).

1. Please complete the section headed "Recognition of Prior Learning" if you would like your previous studies and experience to be considered for credit.
2. When we receive your application and relevant documents, we will send you an evaluation of your prior learning credits together with a letter explaining enrolment procedures.

3. Together with your application, the relevant forms need to accompany the original application form. As soon as feedback upon your credit report is received, you can enrol for your first subjects and only then is the registration fee and amount for the first subjects payable.
4. Administration Fees: There is an application fee of R170 payable upon application. A non-refundable registration fee of R880, as well as the fee for credits awarded as a result of Recognition of Prior Learning, is payable upon registration. The study fees are payable per subject (minimum of two subjects) after registration fees are paid, as studies proceed during the year (see *Pricing*).
5. Please also take note that the above amounts are applicable currently. There will be an annual price increase on subjects and registration fees.
6. Direct/electronic payments are also possible. In this case, a copy of the deposit slip or transfer must be faxed through to the College Administrator. Four to five weeks should be allowed for processing each order.
7. With your first subjects you will receive your MySATS username and password.
8. Please make use of this to log into MySATS and gain access to your academic information. Please note that only the codes provided by a Word of Faith Bible College Administrator will be valid. Students will be given access to a computer and the Internet.

## **Curriculum Design**

Instead of the traditional curriculum design, SATS researched what Christians at both leadership and non-leadership levels need to know and should be able to do. They then used this analysis to develop a series of learning outcomes and from this, they developed the curriculum. In other words, the subjects you study all yield essential knowledge and skills— there is no redundant or superfluous material in your study programme.

All subjects conform to Bachelor's degree standards and therefore the Certificate counts for a full 120 credits towards a B.Th. degree.

The Diploma in Biblical Studies consists of a further 120 credits (i.e. a total of 240 credits). The Bachelor's programme consists of a further 240 credits (i.e. 480 in total) with an optional exit point at 360 credits; and equates to a Honours degree. For those more familiar with the American system, this equates to the 128 US credit degree. Their aim is to make studying as pleasant as possible for you without compromising standards. Most courses in the Certificate curriculum are completely self-contained and as such, have no prescribed textbooks. In addition, each of these subjects is presented to you in easy to handle units. The Diploma- and Bachelor's programmes are produced in a different format. Instead of an interactive self-contained format, these subjects require you to consult their Readers (or textbooks) and to complete a series of assessment tasks based on a range of books or other resources.

## Pricing

These are current fees. Please allow a 6 to 7,5% increase for 2011.

When you enrol, you are required to pay only the enrolment fee, the fee for credits awarded as a result of Recognition of Prior Learning, and the cost of the first two subjects. When you have passed your first two subjects, you then pay for the next two, and so on. **NB. There are price incentives if you buy more than 3 subjects at a time, but please note that you must complete whatever subjects you buy within 12 months.**

## Changes to Curriculum

If you want to change your curriculum at any stage, a fee of R70 will be levied.

## Special Letters

If you ask the Seminary to write a special letter on your behalf, e.g., confirming that you are enrolled as a student with SATS a fee of R50 per letter will be levied (including postage), or \$10 for foreign students.

## Transcripts

On graduation, you will receive a copy of your official transcript free of charge. Subsequent official copies will cost R70 (including postage) for local students and \$20 for foreign students, and will only be mailed directly to the institution which has requested it.

## Assessment

### 1. Undergraduate Programmes

Assignments and portfolios: You are required to score at least 60 percent in order to demonstrate competence. If you do not achieve this minimum, but you have demonstrated that you are close to the required level of competence, you will be assigned extra work which will assist you, and the marker will provide comprehensive guidelines as to what you should do. If your submission demonstrates that you clearly need to do further research across the board, you will be requested to redo the task.

Unless a subject has no examination, (in which case the assignments count 100 percent of the final mark), assignments count 80 percent of the final mark.

Examinations count 20 percent of the final mark. The pass mark for examinations is 50 percent or 60 percent, depending on the nature of the examination.

In addition, during your first, second and third years, WFBC requires that you complete fifteen hours of practical ministry per week in one of three possible ministries at Word of Faith Christian Centre.

## **2. Postgraduate Programmes**

A detailed policy for assessment of the Masters and Doctoral programmes is available from the SATS Registrar of Postgraduate Studies, on request.

### **Credit Accumulation and Qualification**

Except in the case of the Certificate in Christian Counselling, each subject is worth 12 credits, which will accrue towards your qualification. When you complete your studies, whether or not you have earned a qualification, you will be issued with a transcript detailing all your subjects and the credits you have earned.

In order to be awarded a qualification at Certificate level, you will need to have accumulated 120 credits. For a Diploma you need 240 and for a four-year Bachelor's 480. A further 180 are needed to obtain the Master's degree (i.e. 660 credits in total), and a further 360 credits for the Doctor of Theology degree.

### **Progression**

Once you have met all the requirements for your chosen qualification, you will be awarded the qualification.

We expect that all our students will conduct all their academic affairs associated with WFBC and SATS in a way which befits Christ's disciples. Plagiarism, for example, is unacceptable, as is the copying of another student's work, or making any defamatory remarks about WFBS, SATS or their staff. For the full policy, please refer to the SATS Student Handbook (downloadable after registration).

### **Student Registration Contract**

Please note that when you sign the application form, you agree to abide by the policies of SATS. Please refer to the SATS Student Handbook for more details.

### **Student Complaints and Grievances**

Should you have reason to query the way in which the assessment of your assignments or examinations has been conducted, or if you wish to lay a complaint against a staff member, or if you have a grievance about any other matter, the procedures for doing so are set out in the SATS Student Handbook.

### **E-learning**

E-learning with SATS (full-time students) affords the student the following benefits.

- More access to academic facilitator
- Active interaction with other students

- No exams
- Higher success rate (80–85% as opposed to 70% for downloaded)

The e-learning courses are run over an 11–12 week period and students will be expected to complete approximately one submission every two weeks. Students cannot fall behind and try and catch up—a missed submission will mean a zero mark for that particular assignment.

During the week Nicolene, Desmond and their team have “church” in the primary schools of our city to currently over 10 000 children. They teach during the Life Orientation periods. The Junior Youth, Y2Jam, also organise holiday clubs and children’s camps. Kingdom Kids is our Children’s Ministry on Sunday mornings when students will have the opportunity to learn various skills in reaching and teaching children.

### **Practical Youth Ministry 1, 2 and 3**

#### **PRACTICUM IN YOUTH AND HIGH SCHOOL MINISTRY WITH PASTOR MATTHEW CULLIS**

Pastor Matthew leads Solid Rock Youth, the Youth Ministry at Word of Faith Christian Centre, a dynamic ministry with branches in other areas of the city. There are over five hundred young people in this city network. They meet for youth services on Fridays with dynamic praise and worship, testimonies and teaching. Pastor Matthew also organises youth camps during the year. New doors have opened into high schools ministry and therefore a lot of opportunity exists in this pioneering work which will be modelled on our unprecedented success in primary schools.

### **Practical Music and Arts Ministry**

#### **SPECIAL INTEREST PRACTICUM IN MUSIC AND ARTS MINISTRY WITH ANIKA MILLHOUSE**

Practical Ministry in the Music & Arts Department is designed to equip students in the vocal, instrument, technical and visual arts as they serve in this helps ministry of Word of Faith. Depending on the field of interest and gifting, students will be assigned to specific areas in the ministry under the mentorship of the department’s leadership working on specific projects within the department. The Music & Arts Department flows strongly in the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Therefore this practical area is ideal for those with a keen prophetic anointing. Our team approach ensures that

students will become a part of a family environment among fellow musicians, singers and artists.

The rule for full-time students is that you must include at least one but no more than two practicums (those marked with a †). This means that at least one of the courses listed above will have to be dropped. Please note that PCM2123, PCM2124 and the Special Interest Practicum are the preferred choices, because there are current programmes at Word of Faith Christian Centre to support these. Special arrangements would have to be made for the other two.
